Tips:

Some ideas for defining the motion: Look at the 'our' in the motion. The 'our' could be the citizens of Ireland or even the members of your debates team. Is it really the responsibility of regular Irish citizens to combat the problem of Climate Change or governments and large corporations? On the other hand the consumption levels of individuals (cars, fossil fuels, eating meat) have a huge impact on Climate Change.

The Sustainable Development Goals or SDGs for short were set up by the UN in 2015. The SDGs are 17 unique goals looking to tackle some of the biggest problems facing the world today from poverty to hunger to lack of education. These goals do not just focus on poor countries in the developing world but all countries from Ireland to Malawi. 193 governments across the world have signed up to commit to these goals. Some people feel that the goals are too ambitious and that there isn't enough money or will from governments to achieve the goals by 2030. Others believe that
