Features of Severe Malnutrition

1. Economic deprivation

- \rightarrow Poverty
- \rightarrow High work loads to cope with conditions (esp. Women)

2. Social exclusion

- \rightarrow Clustered in poorest families
- \rightarrow Malnourished siblings

3. Individual pathological changes

- \rightarrow Metabolic reductive adaptation
- \rightarrow Immunosuppression



Aims of CTC

 \rightarrow Improve coverage

→Increase capacity of communities to manage and prevent acute malnutrition

- → Decrease dependence on external interventions
- \rightarrow **Provide exit strategies** for emergency interventions

Coverage of therapeutic programmes is low

Coverage in 2001 <1%

Coverage in 2020 ~ 10-15%

- Nobody with knowledge of amino acid enhanced plantbased RUTF recipes was allowed to participate
- Data on cost reduction was not shared with the review committee
- The cost effectiveness evaluation was deliberately not commissioned
- The meta-analysis approach dragged down the effectiveness by including non-amino acid enhanced recipes that we had rejected because they didn't work.

To improve treatment access and acceptability CTC focused on main factors limiting impact

- Coverage & cost
- Community participation / engagement
- Simplicity of implementation
