

Concern Worldwide in Rohingya Response



Concern Worldwide is working mainly under the Nutrition Sector operating **16 Integrated Nutrition Facilities (INF) and One Stabilization Centre** in the camps to provide essential nutrition services to vulnerable families.

In the camps, Concern provides the best quality comprehensive acute malnutrition treatment and prevention to ensure lifesaving nutrition support for children under five years, and pregnant and lactating women.

In the host community, our priority is to reduce poverty and build resilient communities, by supporting livelihood activities working with the Government of Bangladesh. Our key priorities are to provide nutrition services, and build livelihoods and resilience for those most vulnerable groups especially children and women in Cox's Bazar camps and host communities.

As a part of our Country Strategic Plan, one of the goals is that **people affected by natural disaster and human induced crisis are empowered to take action and build their resilience.** In addition one of our objectives is to provide immediate, long term support and build resilience among people affected by the Rohingya Refugee Crisis and support disaster risk reduction (DRR) activities to withstand various shocks and stresses.

Specifically we will focus on:

- **Working with the nutrition sector to deliver nutrition interventions** under the Rohingya Refugee Crisis
- Developing a partnership with a local partner to deliver nutrition sensitive activities in both camps and host communities as well as livelihood activities in host communities

Concern Worldwide will continue providing both immediate and long-term support to the Rohingya community and the immediate host communities. We will continue being a leading nutrition actor in the Rohingya Response whilst shifting gradually from direct implementation of nutrition services to supporting local partners to fulfil this role.



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Major Activities

- Provide community-based management of acute malnutrition among children under 5 years, pregnant and lactating women.
- Provide services to promote optimal Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) practices
- Early Childhood Care and Development services.
- Community-Based Management of at-risk Mothers and Infants (CMAMI) intervention for infant 0-5 months and mothers
- Inpatient care services for children with Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) and medical complications in the Stabilization Centre.
- Support adolescent girls with improved access to nutritional services including micro-nutrient supplementation and nutrition awareness.
- Support innovative home gardens.
- Support small business and other income generating activities for host communities.
- Awareness session on nutrition for community influential persons, husband, mother in laws and the elderly.
- Community sensitization and Social Behavior Change Communication (SBCC) activities through care group approaches.
