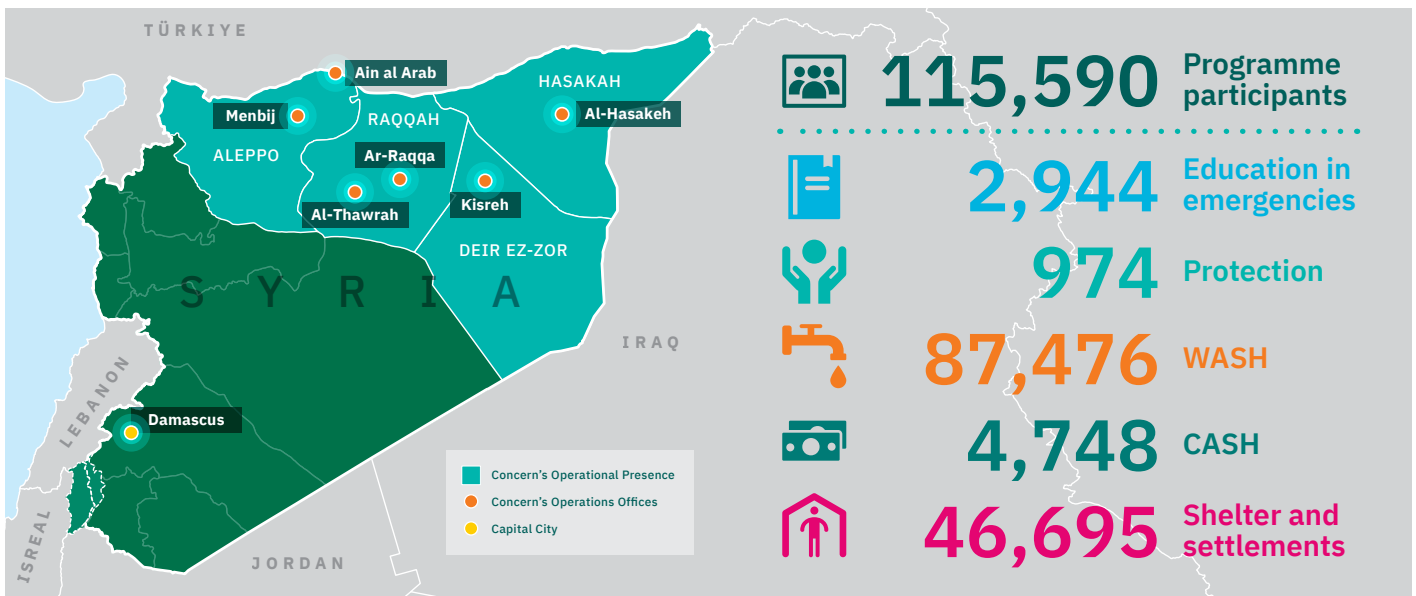

Concern Worldwide operations with DG ECHO

In 2023, after 13 years of conflict in Syria, the scale, severity and complexity of needs remain extensive as 15.3 million people are in need of humanitarian assistance and 6.7 million internally displaced people (IDPs), the highest number of IDPs in the world. Across the country, conflict affected population are living in catastrophic conditions with lack of education, water, adequate housing, food, protection services and live in extreme poverty, vulnerable to natural disasters and hostilities.

The objective of Concern and DG ECHO is to address the complexity of needs by providing an integrated response to gap the overlapping needs of those most in need. To achieve this, Concern through DG ECHO support provides: Education, Protection, WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene), Cash Assistance, Shelter, and Disaster Risk Reduction services, as well as supports the Coordination mechanism. The project now at its sixth phase continues to reach those most vulnerable building on previous achievements.



KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- In Education, Concern reintegrated 83.87% of children into formal education
- Provided 20 tons of chlorine powder in response to the cholera outbreak
- Following the Earthquake, Concern assessed the damages of water stations and networks to ensure access to clean water
- In March 2023, Concern conducted a rapid assessment in response to the flash floods planned to respond to the emergency needs of the affected population

EDUCATION

2,104 children enrolled in non-formal education – 89% of final target

73% of caregivers attending sessions; 122% of final target

2,104 children reached through **13 non-formal education centres** and **7 supported schools**

840 caregivers (702 female, 138 male) provided with parenting skills sessions

WATER SANITATION & HYGIENE

54,595 people with access to sufficient and safe water for domestic use; 39% of final target

5,160 people with access to dignified, safe, clean and functional toilets; 41% of final target

10 chlorination systems rehabilitated

4 electrical transformers installed

17,173 people reached through emergency water trucking

PROTECTION

708 children benefited from psychosocial support – 47% of final target

5 child-friendly spaces established

181 referrals made for children in need to access to other services

SHELTER & SETTLEMENTS

283 people with access to basic, safe and dignified shelter; 31% of final target

46,412 people in receipt of winter assistance; 107% of final target

36 rehabilitated shelters of 723 assessed

28,902 vulnerable IDPs provided with winter NFI assistance

7,046 people received cash for winter assistance

10,374 individuals received cash for fuel

MULTI-PURPOSE CASH

770 households (4,757 individuals) in receipt of first round of multi-purpose cash
