

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) or Global Goals are a collection of 17 interlinked global goals designed to be a "blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all"



The SGDs were set by the United Nations (UN) in 2015 to be achieved by 2030 with the support of all member states



The arts is a small word for a broad range of activities and experiences which includes literature (poetry and novels); performing arts (music, dance, opera, theatre and film) and visual arts (drawing, painting and sculpting)

The SDGs recognise that ending poverty goes handin-hand with improving health and education, reducing inequality, all while tackling climate change and working to preserve our oceans and forests.

Around a quarter of the population of Liberia does not have adequate access to healthcare. Childcare and feeding practices need to be improved to protect children against sickness and malnutrition. But thanks to the art of song, a certain part of Liberia is seeing great improvements.

"Let's sing together. One, two, three..."

The crowd inside the small tin-roof community hall in Wrobone village break into a smile at Korpo Jallah's instructions. They know what is coming next. She begins to clap her hands, moving gently from side to side. They all rise to their feet and lift their voices:

"Healthy baby, shiny baby, clever baby."

# THE **PROPOSITION** MAY MAKE AN ARGUMENT SUCH AS THIS ONE:

# "Art has the power of taking big ideas of worldwide transformation and communicating them to all people."

On the 24th of September 2024, SDG Action Zone collective hosted a webinar focusing on 'Arts guiding the way to the SDGs'. During this event, it was noted that art has long played an important role in spreading awareness of global issues. The opportunities art presents highlight possibilities for change and the urgency of working towards accomplishing the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030.

At the beginning of the webinar, the author Bell Hooks was quoted: "The function of art is to do more than tell it like it is – it's to imagine what is possible". Art is not just a pretty painting, it is the pulse of society, the heart of the change people want to see in their local and global communities.

# THE **OPPOSITION** MAY MAKE AN ARGUMENT SUCH AS THIS ONE:

# "Arts-based initiatives often lack clear metrics for measuring success and impact, making it challenging to assess their role in achieving SDG targets.

In Ireland, arts and health projects aim to support SDG 3 (Good Health and Wellbeing). For example, Helium Arts is a charity that uses creative arts to improve the well-being of children with long-term health conditions. They have shown this reduces isolation and improves self-esteem for the children they work with. However, measuring specific health outcomes—such as reduced hospital visits or improvements in physical health—is challenging, which are indicators typically used to track SDG 3. This makes it difficult to assess how directly arts initiatives contribute to health goals on a national or global scale.

After 5 minutes, your teacher will ask each group to rank the **5 SDGs** they have chosen in order of importance from **1st to 5th** and share this with the class.






